At the Parish Council meeting on 10th December 2024, it was resolved that Warburton Parish Council should apply for a precept for the 2025/2026 financial year. The Parish Council continues to recognise that the economic climate is still extremely difficult for residents and therefore the precept will once again remain at £50 for a Band D property.

The money raised will be used towards the following :

- Work is ongoing for our Neighbourhood Plan but more costs are envisaged. Completion of the Neighbourhood plan will give the Parish Council more say on future development.
- There is still the threat of major development which would swamp our village. Funds are needed for legal support and consultancy.
- Speeding traffic is a major concern. Your Parish Council has employed a traffic consultancy company to advise how best to reduce this threat. Work is ongoing to improve signage both within and on the boundaries of the village.
- As Warburton Parish covers a large area it has been decided we need more than one defibrillator. Sites are being sourced.
- Work is still progressing towards a Heritage Trail around the village and new signage will be required.
- Your previous Parish Clerk had been working for the past five years on a voluntary basis but has now handed over to a salaried clerk who is working to support you and your Parish Councillors.

The amounts to be set for each property band are:

Band A, being 6/9 of Band D = £33.33 Band B, being 7/9 of Band D = £38.89 Band C, being 8/9 of Band D = £44.44 Band D, being 9/9 of Band D = £50.00 Band E, being 11/9 of Band D = £61.11 Band F, being 13/9 of Band D = £72.22 Band G, being 15/9 of Band D = £83.33 Band H, being 18/9 of Band D = £100.00
